Living in Liverpool is dramatically more affordable than London. The difference extends well beyond just rent; energy costs, food bills and general day-to-day expenses are all considerably lower. It is worth noting that average salaries in London are around 34% higher, which partially offsets the difference in living costs. This kind of gap can fundamentally alter your standard of living and saving potential.

The weather gap between London and Liverpool is significant. London receives around 159 more hours of sunshine per year and it is also drier, with roughly 208 mm less rainfall annually. Residents of London benefit from a meaningfully more pleasant climate, which makes a real difference to daily life, outdoor activities and general wellbeing.

London comes out just ahead on lifestyle factors. Its advantages include Major Airport Nearby, Strong Rail Links, Large City. However, the margin is slim and the other city is far from lacking – it simply has a slightly different mix of strengths.

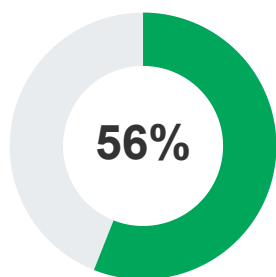

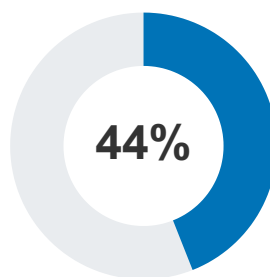
