From a purely financial standpoint, choosing between Plymouth and Nottingham is essentially a coin toss. The overall cost of living – factoring in housing, utilities, food and earning potential – is near-identical, so your budget would stretch about the same distance in either location.

Plymouth has a slight edge over Nottingham in terms of overall weather. Plymouth receives around 283 more hours of sunshine per year and it is also drier, with roughly 269 mm less rainfall annually. The difference is modest, but over the course of a year it contributes to a marginally more pleasant climate.

Lifestyle & Location

Plymouth offers a notably stronger lifestyle proposition than Nottingham. Standout features include Coastal Location, Access to Nature. That said, Nottingham has its own draws such as Student Population, Affordable Housing. For many people, the breadth and quality of what Plymouth brings to the table will be a compelling draw.

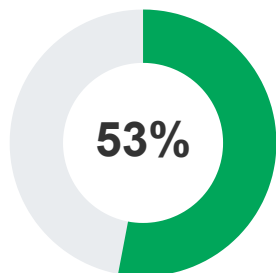

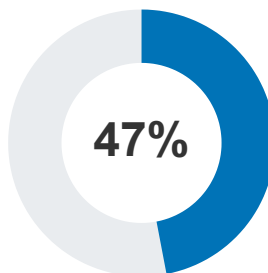
